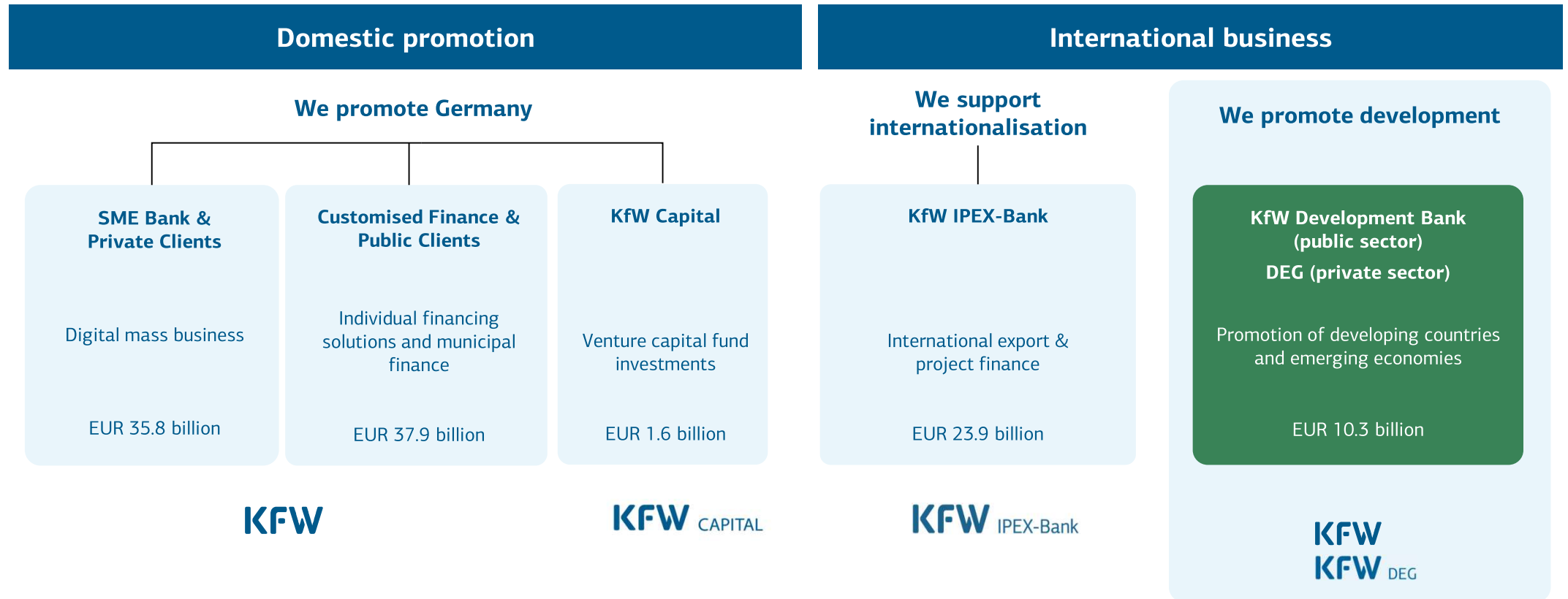

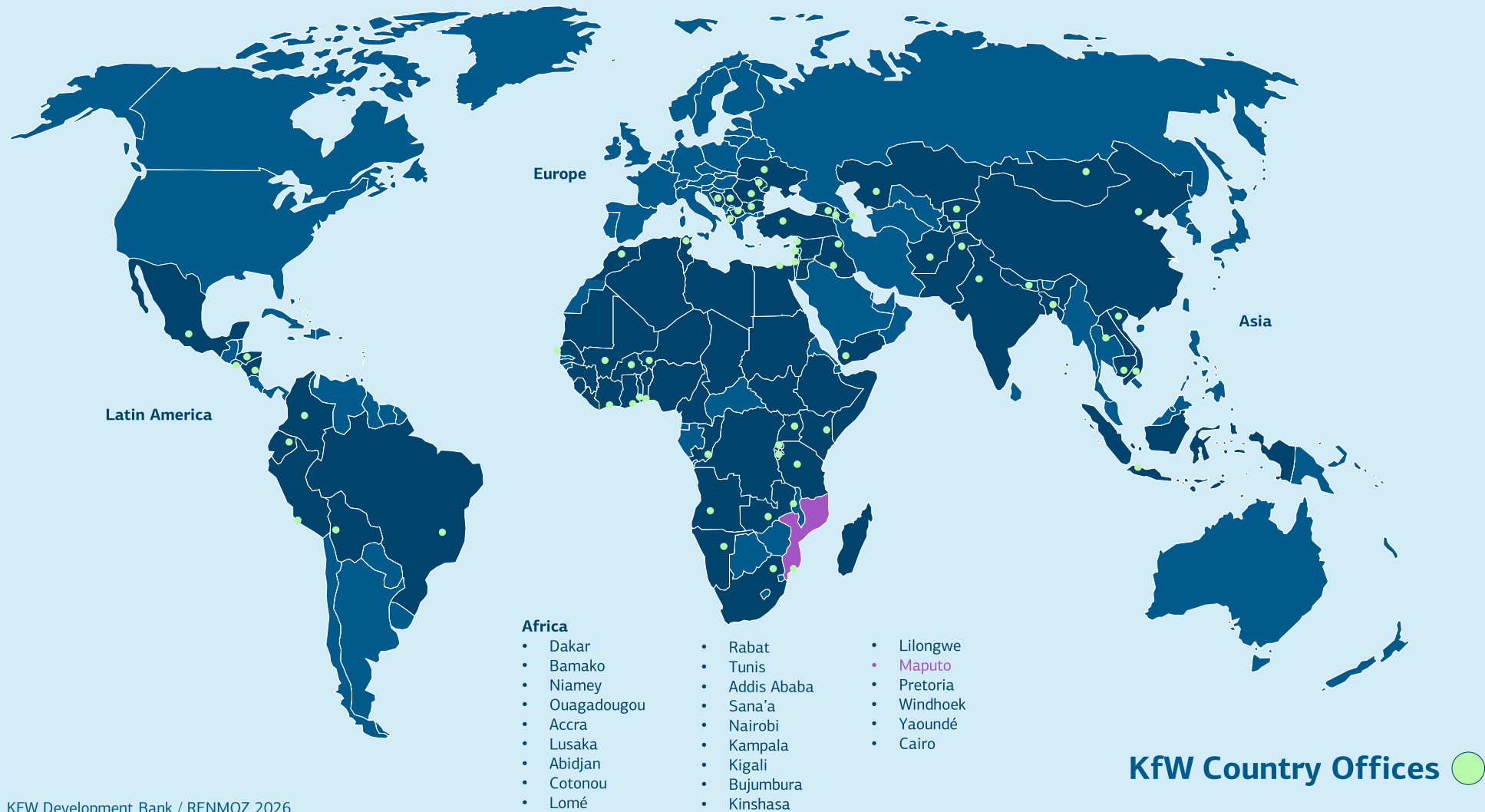

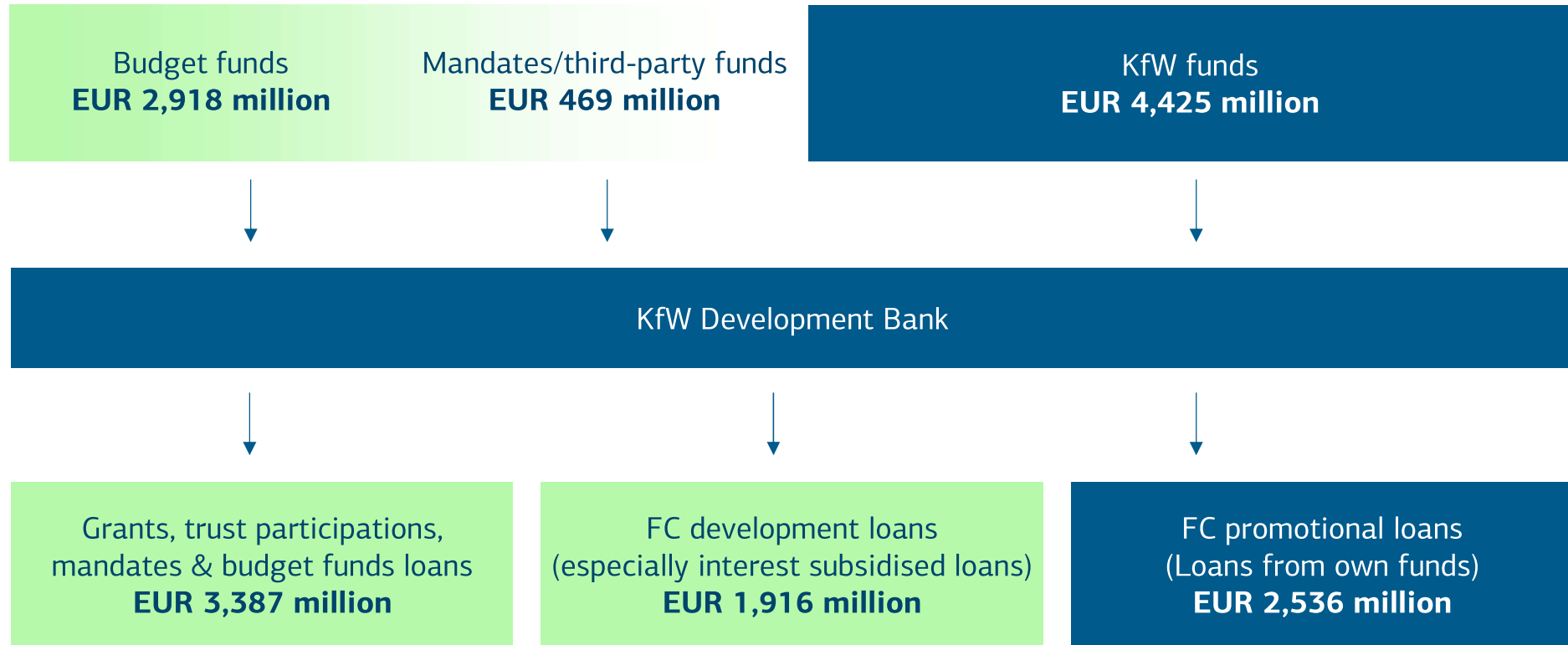

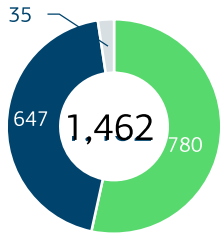
Source of funds and financing instruments (EUR million)



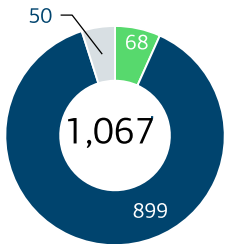

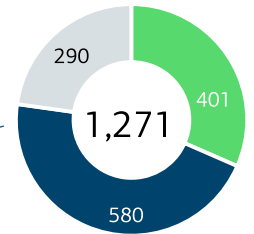
Distribution by region – Overview (in EUR million)

■ Budget funds

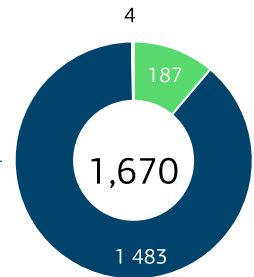

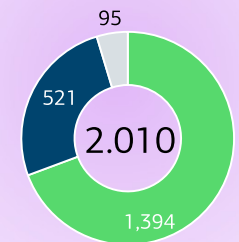

Expected impacts - a selection of standard indicators

With the financing from the year 2024, it is expected that in the coming years...



Over **3.6 million tonnes of CO2e** will be reduced or avoided annually in GHG emissions (over the next 20 years)



A contribution to the protection of over **95 million ha** of protected areas will be achieved



More than **463,000 jobs** will be created or secured



Over **4.7 million people** will be supplied with clean drinking water



Over **378,000 people** will gain first-time or improved access to a modern energy supply



Over **30 million people** in crisis contexts will benefit from improved access to basic services



Over **2.8 million people** will be socially protected or their social security improved



Over **6.3 million people** will be supported in coping with the impacts of climate change



Over **20.2 million people** will receive healthcare services annually



Over **6.3 million people** will eat better and more healthily

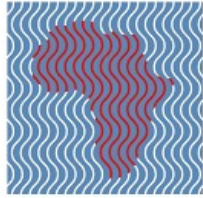
